From the Chairman

Costs

As a reminder, the implementation date for Lord Justice Jackson's "Review of Civil Litigation Costs" is 1st April 2013, in particular new costs management rules which will apply to all multi-track cases in all courts except the Commercial Court, unless the court orders otherwise. This will clearly have an impact on experts, and I recommend that all experts research the requirements soon; a Google search for "Review of Civil Litigation Costs 1st April 2013" will provide a rich mine of information.

CPR is Changing

As a result of the Jackson Reforms there will be many changes which come into force on 1st April 2013. Most of them will only have an indirect effect on Experts but there is one which will have direct consequences for all Experts practising under CPR.

The wording change is simple. P35.4(2) will be amended to read:

- "When a party applies for permission they must provide an estimate of the costs of the proposed expert evidence and identify -
- (a) the field in which expert evidence is required and the issues which the expert evidence will address; and
- (b) where practicable, the name of the proposed expert.

(3) If permission is granted it shall only be in relation to the expert named or the field identified under paragraph (2). The order granting permission may specify the issues which the expert evidence should address."

The effect of this change is that Experts will have to be very careful in discussing before accepting an appointment exactly what they are to do. They are also going to be required to give a fee and expenses estimate. Judging by the recent Pilot it does not seem likely that departure (i.e. increase of fees or expenses) from the submitted budget will be easily approved by the court.

There will be further information coming and when the full changes (including the outcome of the Civil Justice Council's submission to the Rules Committee on The Protocol) are known an Expert's Seminar will be announced.

Family Procedure Rules

Practice Direction 15B (Adults who may be protected parties and children who may become protected parties in family proceedings) has now been finalised and took effect on 31 January 2013. In addition changes to Part 25 and its associated Practice Direction have also come into effect.
