Another Wasted Costs Order awarded against Expert Witness

Experts have yet again found themselves in the spotlight with judicial criticism.

In Re: ABCDEF [2019] EWHC 406 (Fam) the Expert failed to comply with court directions which resulted in a Wasted Costs Order against the Expert. This case has now been followed with another expert having a Wasted Costs Order made against them for £89,000.

In Samantha Thimmaya v Lancashire Teaching Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust [2020] HHJ Claire Evans ordered that a medical expert pay a significant part of the Defendant's costs when she found that the expert acting for the Claimants had failed in his duties to the court.

It became apparent during crossexamination that the Expert, Mr Jamil, was "wholly unable to articulate the test to be applied in determining breach of duty in a clinical negligence case" as he could not recall the Bolam/Bolitho test.

These issues in cross-examination initially arose from the wording used in the Joint Statement that Mr Jamil had prepared with the Defendant's Expert.

As a result the Claimant was left with no option but to discontinue the claim.

The Defendant subsequently made an application for a third-party costs order relying on the expert's lack of understanding of the test for breach of duty as well as his lack of experience in the relevant surgical procedure.

It later transpired that prior to the commencement of the trial the Expert had been suffering from mental health issues and had previously been on sick leave from November 2017, subsequently retiring from clinical practice in 2018. Neither of these facts had been disclosed by Mr Jamil to those instructing him.

The Bolam test is a test that can be carried out to ascertain whether a doctor or other medical professional has breached their duty of care to a patient.

In her judgement the Judge said the Expert "owed important, and significant, duties to the Court. He failed comprehensively in those duties from November 2017 onwards....Whilst it would not be right to use him as an example to send a message to experts, it is right that experts should all understand the importance of their duties to the Court and the potential consequences if they fail in them."

Whilst this is perhaps an extreme example, and one we are pleased to say did not happen to a TAE member, it is a salutory lesson of the dangers of not:

- fully understanding and fulfilling your role
- being completely transparent with your instructing solicitors

Evening Meetings


The Academy generally holds six free Evening Meetings per year.

Income Tax Relief

Members in the UK are able to offset subscriptions against tax.

The Academy of Experts has been approved as a Learned Society by the Board of Inland Revenue under Section 201 Income and Corporation Taxes Act 1988 (subsequently Section 344 of the Income Tax (Earnings & Pensions) Act 2003), with effect from 6th April, 1992 and is published by them known as "List 3".

How to claim

In order to claim tax relief, you will need to use your invoice for your membership payment, which you can then submit to the tax office with your tax return form. Please quote The Academy of Experts (formerly 'British Academy of Experts') along with our tax reference number SAPP/T/1644/43/1922.

If you don't complete a tax return, you can make a claim by writing or phoning your local tax office (your employer will be able to give you the address and reference).
